Bachelor of Arts in Sport Management

The Bachelor of Arts in Sport Management degree trains individuals in the inner workings of the business of sports. Students will be prepared to take positions in sports management with teams, leagues, arenas, colleges, or recreation organizations. They will learn the concepts of event marketing, fiscal management, liability and risk, and communications in sports.

Transfer Pathway

The transfer pathway into all of SMC’s bachelor’s degrees include the following elements: the student must have earned an Associate in Arts or Associate in Science degree or have earned 60 credit hours of transferable general education coursework with a minimum of a 2.00 GPA from a regionally accredited college or university.

Competency in Foreign Language at the 102 (SPAN 140 for heritage Spanish speakers) or higher level is required. Up to six elective hours may be used to achieve Foreign Language competency; otherwise, elective hours must be taken at the 300 level or higher.
