The Kaltura Media Platform is an all-in-one solution for recording, storing, and submitting video assignments in D2L Brightspace. Your professors may require you to submit a video presentation, take an interactive video quiz, or submit a video discussion post.

My Media and Course Media Gallery



My Media is located on the NavBar of the Brightspace homepage. It can always be easily accessed by clicking Video at the top of any Brightspace page. My Media is a repository for all of your videos, which can then be distributed to any of your courses.

Every user has a personal, searchable repository for viewing and managing private media content. The videos you record using Kaltura will be published to My Media.

The Course Media Gallery is a searchable gallery of media content of a particular course. Basically, every video you create for a particular course gets stored here.

Recording Videos with Kaltura

Kaltura is built into Brightspace. You can find it by clicking on Video on the Navbar. My Media is the hub for all the video content you create. My Media is where you will launch either Kaltura Express Capture or Kaltura Capture for video recording.

Kaltura Express Capture

Kaltura Express Capture enables recording content directly from the browser without the need to install any additional software.

This is the only way you can create videos using Kaltura if you have a Chromebook.

Kaltura Capture

Kaltura Capture enables you to create high-quality recordings. You can record yourself with a webcam, record your screen or presentation, or a combination of both. You have to download this software to your computer.

Kaltura Capture is not compatible with Chromebooks. See the Chromebook Users section for more information.

How to Record a Video With Kaltura Capture

Submitting Video Assignments

Students can only submit Kaltura video assignments using the Insert Stuff button, which is available on the textbox.



After recording your Kaltura video, follow the <u>How to Submit Video Assignments on</u> <u>Brightspace</u> tutorial. The tutorial video shows you how to submit video assignments and video discussion posts.

Submitting a Help Desk Ticket:

Chromebook Users

If you a Chromebook, you can only use Kaltura Express (web-based video recording) to record videos. Kaltura Capture isn't compatible with Chromebooks.

Chromebook users who need to record their desktop need to use an alternative like <u>Screencast-o-Matic</u>. Screencast-o-Matic is a free screen recording, editing, and storage solution.

Notes on Using Screencast-o-Matic:

- The free version of Screencast-o-Matic has limitations: you can record your screen and/or webcam and do simple trimming; videos have to be shorter than 15 minutes and there will be a watermark
- <u>Chromebook</u> users can use Screencast-o-Matic for web screen recording because Chromebooks can't use Kaltura Capture for screen recording, but they can use Kaltura Express Capture for webcam recordings

- After you record your video to Screencast-o-Matic, you have a few options:
 - Submit a link to the Screencast-o-Matic video on Brightspace (instructions)
 - <u>Download</u> a Screencast-o-Matic video and upload it to your MY Media before submitting on Brightspace (<u>instructions</u>)

Kaltura Interactive Video Quizzes

Your professor may require you to complete a Kaltura Interactive Video Quiz (IVQ). For best results, use a laptop or desktop computer to complete the quiz. Always make sure you are using Google Chrome or Mozilla Firefox when taking the quiz. Watch the <u>Taking</u> <u>a Kaltura Interactive Video Quiz</u> tutorial before taking an IVQ.

Kaltura Virtual Classroom

Your professors may hold class sessions or office hours in the Kaltura Virtual Classroom. Each Brightspace course has its own Kaltura Virtual classroom.

Inside the Virtual Classroom, you can engage with your professor and fellow students through interactive tools like a whiteboard, screen sharing, breakout rooms, real-time notes, live quizzes, and more.

Step 1: Prepare for Virtual Classroom Sessions

Your instructor may use Kaltura Virtual Classroom to host virtual class meetings or office hours. Refer to the course syllabus or the class announcement posted on your D2L Brightspace course for more information about how your instructor will use the Virtual Classroom.

Before your first virtual class session, you must prepare your device. We recommend you use a laptop or a desktop computer. Usually, a laptop has a built-in microphone and

webcam. For a desktop, if there is no built-in camera or microphone, we recommend purchasing a webcam and a microphone (or headphones with a mic).

To engage in live class participation, although it may not be required to show your video, you will need to use a microphone to speak to your instructor or fellow students during a live class meeting.

Step 2: Join the Virtual Class Meeting

Follow the instructions below to test out the technology for the Kaltura Virtual Classroom before you attend a session.

First, perform a <u>Quick Tech Check</u>. If your internet or device does not pass the requirements, contact your professor immediately. You may need to use an alternate device or arrange to attend the live sessions in a different location with faster internet.

Second, review the <u>Participant Guide</u>, so you understand how the Kaltura Virtual Classroom works.

Third, watch the <u>Kaltura Virtual Classroom Overview for Student</u> tutorial video to learn how to use the application.
