

TRANSFER AGREEMENT
between
SPARTANBURG COMMUNITY COLLEGE (SCC)
and
SPARTANBURG METHODIST COLLEGE (SMC)

This Agreement is entered into between Spartanburg Community College (SCC)
Associate of Arts, Associate of Science
and Spartanburg Methodist College (SMC) .
Bachelor of Arts

It is mutually agreed upon:

ADMISSION AND GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

- A. Spartanburg Methodist College (SMC) admission and program admission requirements apply to both direct entry students and to students who transfer under this agreement. Additionally, upon completion of the requirements of this agreement, SCC students transferring to Spartanburg Methodist College (SMC) will be guaranteed admission to Spartanburg Methodist College (SMC) and receive priority acceptance into the program/college/school of intent.
- B. Students accepted into Spartanburg Methodist College (SMC) must fulfill the Spartanburg Methodist College (SMC) program/award graduation requirements.
- C. Both SCC and Spartanburg Methodist College (SMC) agree to inform and train academic advisors concerning the terms of this agreement and the transfer of courses and programs between the institutions. Advisor names and contact information will be given to each institution.

PROMOTION OF AGREEMENT

- A. Both SCC and SMC agree to promote this agreement to students at all SCC campuses by means of a marketing strategy approved by both institutions. A review of this marketing strategy will take place annually.
- B. For purpose of this agreement, SMC grants to SCC, and SCC grants to SMC, permission to use, display, reproduce, and publish without compensation each other's trademarks as an institutional partner on websites, cobranded web portals, and in print marketing publications.
- C. SMC and SCC will provide electronic versions of the Trademarks for the use permitted by this agreement. Each party represents and warrants that it possesses all rights necessary for the granting of the permissions set forth in this agreement.
- D. Each institution reserves the right to review in advance any information including but not limited to, websites, cobranded web portals, and in print marketing publications.
- E. SMC will be given access to SCC students at all campuses for the purpose of recruitment and promotion of this agreement.
- F. SMC will promote agreement for students not accepted directly to their institution.

STUDENT RESPONSIBILITIES OF AGREEMENT

- A. Students desiring to take advantage of the terms of the transfer agreement must complete all requirements to enjoy the rights and privileges of the agreement.

- B. Students who enter into this transfer agreement will be guaranteed the rights and privileges outlined in the agreement once the agreement is signed and contingent upon their strict adherence to the requirements (both curricular and non-curricular).
- C. Students are encouraged to enroll in Associate of Arts / Associate Science. Signed agreements will be sent to SMC and a copy kept in the Enrollment Services office of SCC.

TRANSFER OF CREDITS

- A. SMC will accept the Associate of Arts or the Associate of Science Degree or 60 hours of semester credit from the list of courses on the Transfer Guide Table from SCC to apply to SMC's Bachelors of Arts Degree. All courses listed, * even without a direct equivalent, will count in the required 60 hours to be considered the "Equivalent of the Associate Degree." Up to 36 semester credit hours can transfer to SMC from the direct equivalent list for students without an Associate Degree or 60 semester credit hours.
- B. Courses will transfer as described in the Transfer Guide Table included in this Transfer Agreement.
- C. Courses completed at SMC may be used within graduation guidelines for SCC to complete reverse transfer and award of certificates, diplomas, and degrees from SCC. Both institutions agree to share transfer data and student success data to be used in joint assessment activities and agreement evaluation processes.
- D. SMC's Office of Enrollment Services and SCC's Office of Student Records will maintain communication to promote seamless reverse transfer.

TERMS OF AGREEMENT

- A. The Chief Academic Officers or designees of the parties to this agreement will implement the terms of this agreement, including identifying and incorporating any changes into subsequent agreements, assuring compliance with system policy, procedure and guidelines, and conducting an annual review of this agreement.
- B. Program curriculum and requirements listed in the Program Transfer Table are subject to change. Each institution agrees to make any changes known to the other.
- C. SMC and SCC will ensure that they maintain accreditation with appropriate regional accrediting body to ensure that all operations meet with accreditation requirements of the two institutions.
- D. This Transfer Agreement is effective on April 1, 2019, shall remain in effect for five years unless terminated or amended by either party with 90 days' prior written notice.
- E. This Transfer Agreement will be reviewed by both parties as required but at least annually beginning on or after September 26, 2020.


