Graduation, Transfer-Out Rate

Graduation rate is an IPEDS reported figure. The cohort is based on all entering first-time full-time freshmen, with exceptions allowed for deceased, military and certain civil and religious exclusions. Graduation rate is measured after 150% of program length, which in the case of SMC, is now six years. (Students entering in FA2021 will be counted as positive if they graduate by the end of summer 2027.)

Since SMC's mission includes transfer, the transfer-out rate for the same cohort is also reported. The total graduates plus transfer-out within 150% of program length is counted as the college's Success Rate.
