Spartanburg Methodist College Campus Safety offers **confidential, free support** to students impacted by a crime. Our Victim Advocate is here to help you understand your rights, know what to expect, and feel supported throughout the process.

Victim Advocates can:

- Explain your rights and options
- Connect you with law enforcement, courts, and community agencies
- Attend court hearings with you or on your behalf
- Keep you updated on court dates, case progress, and outcomes
- Help arrange and attend pre-trial meetings

Our Victim Advocate, **Officer Kimberly Eubanks**, can also assist with:

- Understanding the criminal justice process
- Applying for financial help for medical bills, counseling, or lost wages
- Victim Impact Statements and court preparation
- Employer contact, restitution questions, and campus resources
- Counseling and emergency community referrals

Our goal is to support you, respect your choices, and help you feel informed and supported.

Dating & Relationship Safety Support

Campus Safety supports students experiencing **dating violence, relationship abuse, stalking, or harassment**. You are not alone, and help is available.

We can help with:

- Relationship safety education and safety planning
- Understanding protective options (restraining orders, orders of protection, no-contact orders)
- Support with protective order requests and court appearances
- Referrals to confidential counseling, emergency housing, and community support
- Help accessing academic, housing, or work accommodations

All services are **confidential, free, and student-centered**.
